This past spring, the Huntington Harbour Philharmonic Committee Seal Beach Group recently received a call from the sons of Victor Grgas saying they would like to donate a bass.

The late Victor Grgas, a past mayor of Seal Beach, was born and raised in San Pedro. When he was young, his parents enrolled him in

Tamburitzans, a multicultural the musical organization that entertains audiences with ethnic costumes, audiences music and dancers from Eastern Europe.

That is where Victor Grgas learned to play the bass. Afterwards, he played the bass in high school and a band he put together with his friends. The HHPC Seal Beach Group was excited to receive this bass and planned to give it to Los Alamitos High School.

As usual, the HHPC Seal Beach Group takes all donated instru-ments to Morey's Music Store in

Lakewood for evaluation. Most instruments we receive need a bit of repair. The HHPC Seal Beach Group doesn't believe in giving a student an instrument that cannot hold a tune.

As soon as representatives of the group walked in, they wer told that it was a "Rockabilly" were slap bass used in jazz, country, and Tejano music, but not high school orchestra.

Fortunately, it was in good condition and had value to those in its musical genre. They agreed to try to sell it and trade a bass of equal value to the group. Morey's came through. Los Alamitos High School now has a great bass.

Giving old instruments new life has become a hallmark project for the HHPC Seal Beach Group. The HHPC Seal Beach Group reaches out to the community by writing articles in local newspapers asking for no-longer-used instruments that may be taking up space in your closet, attic, or garage

A neighbor recently gave me a

clarinet that he had when he was in middle school.

It looked like it was in great condition to me but, as usual, we took it to Morey's. The repair technician explained how the keys were bent; cost of repair \$65. A new plastic clarinet would cost \$250, so we opted to have the used wood clarinet with superior tone fixed.

Most schools are in need of large instruments that are difficult to cart back and forth to school, such as a tuba, French horn, or bass. Double reed instruments like an oboe or bassoon are difficult to play and very few students play them Consequently, there are few in circulation and are especially needed.

Although the taiko drum is the primary instrument in the performance, other traditional Japanese instruments make an appearance on stage as do traditional dance and vocal performers.






